LEXIE BROWN - #4

Known for a strong, smooth perimeter shot, Brown is an aggressive, confident guard who can take control of a game on offense. Her earliest childhood memory is training with her father, Dee Brown, in an empty gym. Brown's father enjoyed a 12-year NBA career and is currently an assistant coach for the Detroit Pistons.
